Dear Brother Knights and their Ladies,

Once again I take pen in hand and attempt to leave you some gems of wisdom to make life more meaningful. How many of you have heard of Sinsinawa, WI? Recently Muriel and I have visited a nun I knew from working with the Indians in Minneapolis. She is only 93 years old, and all she wants to do is work. Her dedication to the sisters with whom she lives at the Dominican Mound is awe-inspiring. The group of the Dominican nuns was formed by a priest named Reverend Mazzuchelli. Sinsinawa is the mother house of the Dominican sisters. It is such a beautiful scene that I would want to be there for my final resting place. The Dominican sisters staffed the Bethlehem Academy in Faribault for many years.

I will give a short history of their founder. Seventeen year old Samuel Mazzuchelli entered the Dominican Order in Europe in 1873. He studied for the priesthood in Rome, and then was able to travel to the United States. Bishop Fenwick of Cincinnati ordained him, then he sent him as the only missionary priest in an area larger than Italy. He built many churches and other structures in his lifetime. He brought the Gospel to many people, including Native Americans, even to the area that would become the states of Wisconsin and Iowa. He has now been proclaimed "Venerable" (by Pope John Paul II) and is on the road to be declared a Saint.

Recently I met an old school mate of mine after 73 years. How we changed in that amount of time. I did enjoy seeing her again. So often we lose contact with friends and never see them again.

I must apologize for not writing last month. I just found no time or energy to write for you, so please forgive my laziness.

Well the heat of Summer is with us and next month will be more of the same. All we can do is say it's good for the corn, if it doesn't burn up.
